

**Lewis County Fiscal Court  
Special Called Meeting  
July 22, 2011**

AT A SPECIAL CALLED MEETING OF THE LEWIS COUNTY FISCAL COURT, HELD AT THE COURTHOUSE IN VANCEBURG AT 12:00 NOON, KENTUCKY WITH THE HONORABLE THOMAS MASSIE PRESIDING AND WITH THE FOLLOWING MAGISTRATES IN ATTENDANCE: ESQ. PAUL B. SWEARINGEN AND ESQ. JOE BENTLEY WITH ESQ. MILT STANFIELD ABSENT

Thomas Massie, Lewis County Judge Executive, called the meeting to order.

Joe Bentley offered a prayer.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Judge Thomas Massie.

The roll was called with Magistrate Joe Bentley and Magistrate Paul B. Swearingen being present and Magistrate Milt Stanfield being absent.

Judge Massie informed the court that he was told by Bart Bryant, Kentucky Transportation Cabinet District Nine Engineer, that state reimbursement for paving projects under the existing agreements was not possible unless payment was first made by the county to the contractor and supplier.

On a motion made by Judge Massie duly seconded by Joe Bentley with Paul Swearingen voting yes to approve payment to H.G. Mays Corporation and Maysville Materials Company for the **Firebrick-Indian Run Road Project**.

On a motion made by Joe Bentley duly seconded by Paul Swearingen with Judge Massie voting yes to approve payment to H.G. Mays Corporation and Maysville Materials Company for the **Trinity Station Road Project**.

Judge Massie informed the court that the Jailer was quoted \$12,000 to replace a commercial water heater at the jail. Judge Massie also stated that he had found what he believed to be an identical replacement unit for \$5354, and recommended purchasing and installing this unit.

On a motion made by Joe Bentley duly seconded by Judge Massie with Paul Swearingen voting yes to approve the purchase of a commercial hot water heater for the **Lewis County Detention Center**, expenditures not to exceed \$7,000.00.

On a motion made by Judge Massie duly seconded by Joe Bentley with Paul Swearingen voting yes to **adjourn** the meeting.
